Lesson 27 Truth Every Saint Needs To Know

(2 Samuel 12:13...The Lord also hath put away thy sin...)

Unlike men and women, God does not hold sins over the head of HIS saints.

1st Point Every Saint Can Have A New Beginning

- No matter how long or how much the Lord chastens us, we must remember what (Psalm 103:9-11) says.
- We also read in Jonah 3:1 these words: **And the Word of the LORD came unto Jonah the second time.**

Aren't you glad that our God is not like the world? HE doesn't kick HIS saints to the curb!

2nd Point Ministering With A Grieving, Broken Heart (2 Samuel 12:24)

- I think we need to read this verse over and over again because it says something truly powerful to the grieving heart.
- David was able to reach out and minister to someone else with a grieving, broken heart.
- The mother of this child, his wife, was no doubt grieving also.

3rd Point The Hand Of A Forgiving & Comforting God.

(2 Samuel 12:24...) and she bare a son, and he called his name Solomon: and the LORD loved him.

- Saints, there are so many truths wrapped up in these words here in this verse.
- Let's unpack a few of them.
- **A)** Before her son died, God called Bathsheba, Uriah's wife (Note: 2 Samuel 12:15); but here in this verse, Bathsheba is called David's wife.
- **B)** What a powerful picture of the Grace of God, that she, who had been the wife of Uriah is mentioned in the genealogy of the Messiah (Matthew 1:6)
- **C)** The text says **the LORD loved Solomon.** The word Solomon means peaceable.

4th Point An Additional Special Name (2 Samuel 12:25)

- Have you ever looked at all the names that God calls us?
- We are called *saint, believer, beloved, child of God, son of God*, and many more.
- Here, God, through the prophet Nathan, named Solomon “Jedidiah” which **means loved by the LORD.**
- So now we have Solomon, which means “beloved” and David, whose name means “beloved”.

5th Point The Promise-Keeping God

(2 Samuel 7:12-13; 1 Chronicles 22:6-10)

- God had already told David that this son would be born and that he would build the temple.
- God kept HIS promise.
- Every time David and Bathsheba looked at Solomon, his very presence would remind them that **God keeps HIS promises**, that **God had forgiven their past** and that **God had guaranteed their future.**

What is it that we can look at that demonstrates that **God keeps HIS promises**, that **God has forgiven our past**, and that **God has guaranteed our future?**
