What led Nehemiah to make this comment and issue this challenge in verse 17?

Let's go back to chapter 1 verse 1

Here in 1:1 we are told that a man named Nehemiah is living in a palace.

However, in 1:3 we are told;

- the walls of Jerusalem are broken
- the gates of Jerusalem are burned with fire
- result of those two conditions; the people are in great affliction So, Nehemiah is saying in 2:17, You See It, Don't You?
